## Young Women Guests Guidelines

1. Young Women Guests (YWG) are women ages 18- 35 who have not attended a SC Women of the ELCA convention.
2. All YWG will be required to stay in provided housing for the convention. Roommate will be another YWG.
3. Nomination forms from the congregational units will go to the conference coordinator by April 1. The conference leaders will make selections and send in the name(s) of YWG to the YWG coordinator by April 15.
4. Conference leaders will select one SWO nominee from their conference to be the YWG for whom fees are paid by the Synodical Women's Organization (SWO). A conference may sponsor up to 2 additional YWG by paying their convention fees. This means that a conference may send a total of 4 women {Young Women Guest (YWG)/First Timers (FT)} but only 1 YWG and 1 FT will be paid for by the SWO. *It is suggested* that those YWG for whom fees are paid by the conference not be from the same congregation as the SWO nominee. The conference nominees' names must be sent in under the same time frame as set above.
5. All convention registration forms from YWG are to be sent to the Registrar by May 15.
6. One area will be provided for the YWG so that all YWG may be housed together.
7. Time will be provided for YWG to get acquainted. All YWG will be required to attend any orientation or get-together.
8. A Bulletin of Reports (BOR) will be sent to all YWG before convention. This will allow participants to see the agenda, workshops offered, etc.
9. No changes or additions to the YWG, except cancellations, after June 1.

## First Timers Guidelines

1. First Timers (FT) are women of all ages who have never attended a SC Women of the ELCA Convention.
2. All First Timers will be provided housing for the convention.
3. Nomination forms from the congregational units will go to the Conference Coordinator by April 1. The conference leaders will make their selection and send in the name of the First Timer by April 15.
4. Conference leaders will select one SWO nominee from their conference to be the First Timer for whom fees are paid by the Synodical Women's Organization (SWO). A conference may sponsor up to 2 additional women by paying their convention fees. This means that a conference may send a total of 4 women {Young Women\_Guest (YWG)/First Timers (FT)} but only 1 YWG and 1 FT will be paid for by the SWO. *It is suggested* that those women (YWG/FT) for whom fees are paid by the conference not be from the same congregation as the SWO nominee. The conference nominee's names must be sent in under the same time frame as set above.
5. All convention registration forms for First Timers are to be sent to the Registrar by May 15.
6. A Bulletin of Reports (BOR) will be sent to all First Timers before convention. This will allow participants to see the agenda, workshops offered, etc.
7. One area will be provided for the First Timers to meet at the beginning of the Convention.
8. First Timers will be required to attend an orientation of the BOR.
9. First Timers will be invited to attend all business, meals, guest speakers and workshops but, will have no vote in business.
10. First Timers will sit in the visitors section during business sessions.
11. No changes or additions to the First Timers, except cancellations, after June 1.

**Spokane**

*Near Nature — Near Perfect*

By the time you receive this via *The Ripple*, hopefully, I will have more information for you!

My trip to Spokane (pronounced Spô-CAN) was very informative and productive. Although TGPs were not able to book hotels while there; I was able to tour the hotels and get my thoughts together so that when we receive the pricing information we'll be able to get South Carolina's



request in early. What a lovely city with average temperatures in July around 82 with 28% humidity and a year round 260 days of sunshine. They refer to the downtown convention area as a *Convention Center Campus* with a river in full view from most everywhere. Pre and post-convention tours will give us the opportunity to explore the surrounding areas including tours into Montana, Idaho, Oregon and possibly beyond! Here's a little more about Spokane, Washington:

- It's on the sunny side of Washington State only about 2,500 miles from SC
  - It's 32 miles from Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, and 90 miles from Canada
  - It's the largest city between Minneapolis & Seattle & Denver & Calgary
    - Population: 600,000
    - 76 lakes within a 50-mile radius
  - More than 100 restaurants in downtown Spokane
    - Home to six colleges and universities
- Regional business, medical and entertainment hub of the Inland Northwest

**Transportation:** While the cable car downtown will no longer be in service, they have an excellent bus/taxi system but remember, the city is walker and bike friendly! It is accessible by plane, train, and most any other mode of transportation you would like to choose.

**Theaters & Nightlife:** The Bing Crosby Theatre, The Fox, The Knitting Factory, The Civic Theatre

**Other attractions:** Northwest Museum of Arts & Culture (home to some of the world's largest Indian artifacts) & other museums; River Park Square; Riverside State Park; Manito Park & many other parks; two cathedrals; Lake Coeur d'Alene, The Spokane River; Mt. Spokane State Park, Turnbull National Wildlife Refuge; Green Bluff, The Centennial Trail. Also home to 14 wineries, 33 golf courses, the childhood home of Bing Crosby, home of the Fairchild Air Force Base, and the gateway to six National Parks.

**Riverfront Park**—100 acres and the site of the 1974 World's Fair: Take in an Imax movie, ride a gondola over the falls, stroll the recreation trails, have a picnic, rent a bicycle, feed a goat, fish, run through the fountain, or just plain people watch. You can also ride the historic, hand-carved Loeffl Carrousel which features the lead horse, Prince, a giraffe and a tiger.

**What makes Spokane so special?** It's safe, friendly, inexpensive, easy to navigate, and FUN!
